HEBREWS, THE CONCLUSION

Hebrews 13:20-25

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Paul begins the conclusion of his letter to the Hebrews by emphasizing prayer.
 - 1) "Pray for us" vs 18
 - 2) "that I may be restored to you the sooner" vs 19
- B. He also includes his prayer for them
 - 1) Paul was a man of prayer vs 20-21
 - 2) He knew the source of all things
- C. He also includes pleadings and general information
 - 1) "suffer the word of exhortation" vs 22
 - 2) "salute them that have the rule over you" vs 24
 - 3) "Timothy is set at liberty" vs 23
- I. Paul's Prayer For The Hebrews vs 25
 - A. "Now the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus..." vs 25
 - 1) "May God, the source of all peace" TENT
 - 2) "Who has raised our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead" KNOX
 - B. "...that great shepherd of the sheep."
 - 1) John 10:11 "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep."
 - 2) I Peter 5:1-4
 - 3) Isaiah 40:9-11
 - C. "...through the blood of the everlasting covenant."
 - 1) "With the blood of an eternal covenant" ASV
 - 2) "Through the blood by which he ratified the everlasting agreement" GSPD
 - D. "Make you perfect in every good work to do his will..."vs 21
 - 1) "perfect" = καταρτιζω = "to make fully ready", "put in order", "perfectly equip", "prepare fully"

- 2) "Furnish you with everything that is good for the doing of his will" MOF
- 3) It is God who equips us to serve Him
- E. "...working in you that which is well-pleasing in his sight..."
 - 1) "working" = εργον = "that which is brought into being or is accomplished by labor"
 - 2) "Effecting in us that which is pleasing in his sight"
 - 3) He works in us that which gives Him pleasure, not that which gives us pleasure.
- F. "...through Jesus Christ;..."
 - 1) "Through the power of Christ" TAY
 - 2) "By Jesus Christ" CON
- G. "...to whom be glory for ever and ever." Amen
 - 1) "Glory be to Him for ever and ever! Amen!" NOR
 - 2) "To whom glory belongs throughout all ages. Amen"
- II. Paul's Last Plea vs 22
 - A. "And I beseech you, brethren, suffer the word of exhortation..." vs 22
 - 1) "beseech" = $\pi\alpha\rho\alpha\kappa\alpha\lambda\epsilon\omega$ = "to call to one's side"
 - 2) "suffer" = ανεχομαι = "to hold one's self upright",
 "bear up", "hold out", "endure"
 - 3) "exhortation" = $\pi \alpha \rho \alpha \kappa \lambda \eta \sigma \iota \varsigma$ = "a summons to one's side", "a calling near"
 - 4) "I urge you, fellow Christians, listen patiently to what I say to encourage you" BECK
 - B. "...for I have written a letter unto you in few words."
 - 1) "few" = δια = "through", "by means Φαχεων =
 "short", "of number few", "brief"
 - 2) "For I have written you only a short letter"

- C. "Know ye that our brother Timothy is set at liberty..."vs 23
 - 1) "liberty" = $\alpha \pi o \lambda v \omega$ = "to release", "to release from custody those who are in prison"
 - 2) "You know that our brother Timothy has been set free"
- D. "...with whom, if he comes shortly, I will see you."
 - 1) "Along with him if he comes soon, I will see you"
 - 2) "If he comes here soon we will visit you together" TENT
- E. "Salute all them that have the rule over you, and all the saints." vs 24
 - 1) "salute" = $\alpha \sigma \pi \alpha \zeta \sigma \mu \alpha \iota$ = "to draw to one's self", "to embrace"
 - 2) "rule" = ηγεομαι = "to lead", "lead the way", "to go first"
 - 3) "saints" = $\alpha\gamma$ iOi = "holy ones", "the ones who have been made holy by God"
- F. "They of Italy salute you"
 - 1) "Those who come from Italy send you greetings" RSV
 - 2) "The Christians of Italy send their greetings" PHI
- III. What We All Need vs 25
 - A. "Grace be with you all. Amen" vs 25
 - 1) "grace" = $\chi \alpha \rho \iota \varsigma$ = "favour", "friendly willingness", "a kind disposition"
 - 2) "God's blessings be with all of you"
 - 3) "My God's tender care be with you"
 - B. This is our greatest need
 - 1) It is not discussed
 - 2) It is not invoked
 - 3) It is not displayed
