The Office Of A Bishop

I Timothy 3:1-7

Intro:

- A. Desiring the office of a bishop and being called to preach are not the same thing.
 - 1. Men are called to preach without qualification and not according to the flesh.
 - 2. Romans 9:9-16
 - 3. I Corinthians 11:26-31
 - 4. There are examples:
 - a. Amos, herdsman of Tekoah Jeremiah 1:5
 - b. Samuel, Hannah's son
 - c. The Apostles were called while in spiritual immaturity
- B. A God-called preacher should not be set over a church unless he desires the work and he is blameless.
 - 1. He must desire it.
 - 2. He must be blameless.

I. The Desire To Be A Bishop.

- A. Vs la "This is a true saying, if a man desire the office of a bishop..."
 - 1. "True" = $\pi I \sigma T O S$ = "worthy of confidence".
 - 2. "Desire" = $0\rho\epsilon\gamma\omega$ = "to reach", "to stretch out", "To long after", "to try to gain".
 - 3. "Bishop" = $\epsilon \pi \iota \sigma \kappa \sigma \eta$ = "watching over", "taking care of", used to denote men of Athens who were sent to watch over subdued cities.
- B. Vs 1b "...he desireth a good work."
 - 1. "Desireth" = $\epsilon \pi \iota \theta \upsilon \mu \epsilon \omega$ = "to fix the desire upon", "to set one's heart upon".
 - 2. "Good" = $K\alpha\lambda OS$ = "beautiful", "pleasing".
 - 3. "Work" = $\epsilon \rho \gamma o \nu$ = "work", "deed", "that which is brought into being by labor".

II. The Qualification Of A Bishop.

- A. Vs 2a "A bishop then must be blameless..."
 - 1. "Must" = $\delta \in l$ = "it is necessary".
 - 2. "Blameless" = $\alpha\nu\pi\iota\lambda\eta\pi\sigma\sigma$ = "not able to be taken hold of", "beyond reproach".
 - 3. Titus 1:6-7
- B. Paul now gives a list of positive and negative personal characteristics, situations and circumstances that if present or absent, will cause a man to be blamed.
 - 1. Love is not mentioned.
 - 2. Faith is not listed.
 - 3. These are examples of the things Paul has in mind as well as things specific.

III. Things That May Be Used To Reproach The Bishop. Vs 2b

- A. Some positive things
 - 1. "the husband of one wife" = "a one woman man",
 Two wives whether in polygamy or as a result of
 divorce, will cause many problems.
 - 2. "Vigilant" = $\nu\eta\phi\alpha\lambda\iota\sigma$ = "sober", "temperate", "as to wine, abstinent", "watchful", "circumspect".
 - 3. "Sober" = $\sigma\omega\phi\rho\omega\nu$ = "self-controlled", used of one who follows sound reasoning, restrains passions.
 - 4. "Of good behaviour" = KOOμιος = "orderly", "the orderly fulfillment of all duties and a well-ordered inner life".
 - 5. "Given to hospitality" = $\phi \iota \lambda o \xi \epsilon \nu o \varsigma$ = "loving strangers", These were, "of the household of faith". III John 5-6
 - 6. "Apt to teach" = $\delta\iota\delta\alpha\kappa\tau\iota\kappa\sigma$ = "able to teach", "one who is skilled in teaching".
 - 7. "Not given to wine" vs 3 = $\pi\alpha\rhoolvos$ = "one who sits long at his wine", "a slave to drink".
 - 8. "No striker" = $\pi\lambda\eta\kappa\tau\eta\varsigma$ = "not a giver of blows", "one who is prone to violence".

- 9. "Not greedy of filthy lucre" = $\alpha\phi\iota\lambda\alpha\rho\gamma\nu\rho\sigma$ = "for the sake of dishonorable gain" He would use the office to his own advantage".
- 10. "But patient" = $\in \pi l \in lK\eta S$ = "not insisting on just rights", "one given to gently equity".
- 11. "Not a brawler" = $\alpha\mu\alpha\chi$ OS = "not a fist-fighter", "one who's first thoughts are not fighting".
- 12. "Not covetous" = αφιλαργυρος = "love of money".

IV. The Bishop And His Family.

- A. Vs 4 "One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity."
 - 1. "Ruleth" = $\pi \rho o i \sigma \tau \eta \mu i = "to stand before", "to manage".$
 - 2. "Well" = $K\alpha\lambda\omega\varsigma$ = "well".
 - 3. "Subjection" = ὑποταγη = "submission".
 - 4. "Gravity" = $\sigma \in \mu \nu \sigma \eta S$ = "dignity", A man of stateliness and courtesy. A humble man.
- B. Vs 5 (For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?)
 - 1. "Know not" = $01\delta\alpha + 00K$ = "not knowledge".
 - 2. "Take care of" = $\epsilon \pi \iota \mu \epsilon \lambda \epsilon \circ \mu \alpha \iota$ = "to have the management of", "the employment of means for a desired result".
- C. Vs 6 "Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into condemnation of the devil."
 - 1. "Novice" = $\nu \in 0 \oplus \nu = \text{"newly planted"}$, "a new comer to the faith".
 - 2. "Pride" = $TO\phiO\omega$ = "to smoke", "to fume", "to surround with smoke", "to make inflated".
 - 3. "Condemnation" = $K\rho\iota\mu\alpha$ = "judgment".

V. The Bishop And The Unchurched.

A. Vs 7 "Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without..."

- 1. "Good" = $Ka\lambda OS$ = "Good".
- 2. "Report" = $\mu\alpha\rho\tau\nu\rho\iota\alpha\nu$ = "witness".
- 3. "Without" = $\xi \xi \omega \theta \in V$ = "outside" Those who were outside the church for any reason.
- B. "...lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil."
 - 1. "Reproach" = ονειδισμος = "disgrace".
 - 2. "Snare" = $\pi\alpha\gamma\iota\varsigma$ = "the snare made by Satan".
 - 3. "fall under the same sentence".
