#### Who Then Can Be Saved?

#### Matthew 19:16-26

#### Intro:

- A. The central message of all Christian denominations is the way to be saved.
  - 1. All of grace or all of works.
  - 2. Some grace and some works.
- B. Paul addresses this issue.
  - 1. He said our salvation is not a mixture.
  - 2. Romans 11:5-6
- C. In these verses there is revealed the truth.
  - 1. There is only one plan of salvation.
  - 2. It is a gift from God.

#### I. What Good Thing Can Men Do?

- A. The question asked.
  - 1.  $good #1 = \alpha \gamma \alpha \theta os = "worthy of admiration" v.16$
  - 2.  $good #2 = \alpha \gamma \alpha \theta o \nu = neuter of good = "a deed worthy of admiration."$
  - 3. This question was asked by a Jew who expected salvation to be granted upon the basis of admirable deeds. Jesus doesn't change the subject but continues it. Based on admirable deeds you should do the following.
- B. The answer of Jesus.
  - Why are you calling me good? To flatter me? Or do you believe that I am God? v.17
  - 2. enter = εισερχομαι = "to come or go into"
  - 3.  $\underline{\text{life}} = \zeta \omega \eta = \text{``the breath of life''}$  Not merely existence. Some things exist but have no life, but one cannot have life without existence.
  - 4. keep the commandments
  - 5. keep =  $\tau \eta \rho \epsilon \omega$  = "observe attentively"
  - 6.  $\frac{\text{commandments}}{\text{enjoined."}} = \text{evto}\lambda \eta = \text{"that which has been enjoined."}$  "moral injunctions"
- C. The second question, "which".

- 1. which =  $\pi o i o s$  = what? Of what kind or sort? Which vs.18a
- 2. He asked Him, what sort of commandments?" Wms

#### D. The answer of Jesus.

- He relates five of the 10 commandments.
   Vs.18-19
- 2. He then mentions the second of the Great commandment. Matthew 22:35-40
- 3. vs. 40, hang = κρεμαννυμαι = "to be suspended."

# E. The reply and 3<sup>rd</sup> question.

- "All these things have I kept from my youth up." V.20
- 2. <u>kept</u> = "to keep one's self from or as to anything," "to be on one's guard" "watch one's self."
- 3. "...what lack I yet"
- 4. <u>lack</u> = υστερεω = "to be last," "behind", "to come short of or fail of anything," 'to be without"

## F. The "good" things he must do.

- 1. perfect = τελειοs = "what has reached its end,
  term or limit," "complete," "wanting
  nothing."
- 2.  $\frac{\text{treasure}}{\text{store,"}} = \frac{\theta \eta \sigma \alpha \upsilon \rho o s}{\text{suppos}} = \text{"anything laid up in store," hence "valuable," "wealth"}$
- 3. He must do three things. These acts would constitute that good deed worthy of admirations. 1.) Sell all he had. 2.) Give to the poor. 3.) Follow Jesus. To these things gives one, "treasure in heaven", it is the saved persons reward

## II. The Response Of The Young Man.

# A. "But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful:" v.22a

- 1. sorrowful =  $\lambda \nu \pi \epsilon \omega$  = "to be grieved"
- 2. "he turned away in great distress."

# B. "...for he had great possessions."

1.  $\underline{possessions} = \kappa \tau \eta \mu \alpha = \text{``what is acquired by purchase or otherwise, property.''}$ 

2. This young was a self-made man of great wealth.

## III. Jesus Explains Why.

#### A. The plain statement of Jesus. v.23

- 1. rich =  $\pi\lambda$ ov $\sigma$ ios = "abounding in riches"
- 2.  $\frac{\text{hardly}}{\text{food}} = \delta \cup \sigma \kappa \circ \lambda \circ s = \text{``difficult about one's}$
- 3. The extraordinarily rich find it very difficult to eat what God puts on their plate!

#### B. An illustration.

- 1. This must agree with the above statement and not disprove.
- 2. This is based on the thread-needle, the small door in the large door of the city. It was the only way a person could enter after dark.

#### IV. The Disciples Response.

# A. "When his disciples heard it, they were exceedingly amazed, saying, who then can be saved?" v.25

- 1. exceedingly =  $\sigma\phi \delta\alpha$  = "vehemently"
- 2.  $\underline{\text{amazed}} = \epsilon \xi i \sigma \tau \eta \mu i = \text{``to change from one condition to another'', ``to be beside one's self''}$
- 3. "...they were utterly dumbfounded."
- Wealth was a sign of God's love and blessing to the Jew.
- 5. saved =  $\sigma\omega\zeta\omega$  = "to save", preserve safe"

# B. "But Jesus beheld them, and said unto them, with men this is impossible..." v.26

- 1.  $\underline{\text{beheld}} = \epsilon \mu \beta \lambda \epsilon \pi \omega = \text{``to view with steadfastness}$  and attention."
- 2.  $\frac{\text{impossible}}{\text{or power,"}} = \alpha \delta v v \alpha \tau o s = \text{``deficient in strength}$
- 3. It is impossible for a man to save himself by doing some honorable thing.

#### C. "..but with God all things are possible."

1. <u>possible</u> = δυνατοs = "strong," "powerful" "able to be done"

2. Man cannot save himself but God has the power to save anyone.
